The following charts show demographic data for SMT as of October 2014. The Society continues to consider what demographic questions would be most appropriate for its membership and how to make meaningful comparisons of its data with data collected from three organizations:

Lack of specific data collected by these organizations makes comparisons with SMT demographic data a challenge. CMS does not collect data on ethnicity, for example, and, HEADS, which compiles data for the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM), does not distinguish the area of music theory from other areas in music. However, the following charts do show that demographic imbalances within SMT membership are greater than those found in CMS and in music faculty and students in general.



Membership as of October 2014 (Total: 1,164)


